Pastors Ponderings

Rejoice in God's Saints!

On Sunday, November 5th we celebrate All Saints Sunday at 9:00 (and Wednesday the 8th at 7:00). We will be lighting many candles and giving thanks to God for those faithful witnesses who died over the past twelve months. That said, I like this hymn Rejoice in God's Saints (ELW #418) because it calls on us to rejoice not only in God's Saints that are now in heaven but also the many living saints that inspire us and model the faith. Fred Pratt Green, one of my favorite hymn writers states, "In loving, in living, they prove it is true: their way of self-giving, Lord, leads us to you." How might you expand your way of self-giving in this month of thankfulness?

On November 12th we will have two opportunities to worship – 9:00 and 11:00 – with the later worship service being for our ninth grade students who will be affirming their faith. See the related article for their names and please consider coming to celebrate with them and their families this special day! Our reading for this day is from the prophet Hosea 11:1-9 who expresses God's passionate love for God's children.

On November 19th we will hear from another prophet, Isaiah 5:1-7 and 11:1-5 – here the nation of Israel is portrayed as a vineyard. God looks for the fruit of righteousness but only finds injustice. How might you expand your way of bearing fruits of righteousness and denounce social injustices that take advantage of the poor and outcast? Verse 16 of chapter five says, "The Lord of hosts is exalted by justice."

On Tuesday, November 21st at 7:00 we are hosting the Ecumenical Thanksgiving Eve worship service. This is a delightful tradition that brings fellow Christians from Glen Hill Parish UMC and St. John the Baptist Catholic Church together with us to give thanks to God for all of the blessings of the past year. Our worship will be followed by a time of fellowship with delicious treats.

On November 26th we will hear about a profound time in the life of God's people from 2 Kings 22 and 23. After far too much division and plenty of evil kings that did what was evil in the sight of the Lord, King Josiah leads the people into a time of renewed engagement with scripture which fosters reform and renewal. What is especially striking about this is that irrevocable judgment has already been declared because of the people's prior abandonment and rejection of God. Therefore, Josiah's actions are a sign of his willingness to obey God's teachings even though obedience will not bring future benefit. This causes me to wonder. What is your/our motivation for following God's ways? Do you/we act from a place of faith no matter what the future may hold? Or do you/we act in righteous ways only when there's some promised reward? We hope to see you frequently in November as we rejoice, celebrate, reflect, and give thanks!

Grace Place

Salvation Army Grace Place, located at 505 W. 8th Street, New Richmond, Wisconsin, offers shelter to homeless families and single individuals in the St. Croix River Valley, including residents of St. Croix, Pierce and Polk Counties. They are staffed 24 hours a day to ensure all folks receive the services they need.

Family Meals and Fellowship at Grace

Volunteer organizations and church groups provide residents with nourishing dinners each week Monday through Thursday.
