Pastors Ponderings

Once again we are approaching the seasons of Advent and Christmas. And, as this is the place for *Pastor's Ponderings*, I recalled an article I wrote some years ago that invited you to join me in pondering. I am sure that you recall how after Jesus' birth and the visit of the shepherds, "Mary treasured all these words and pondered them in her heart."

There's another place the word ponder shows up — it is in the hymn, *Praise to the Lord, the Almighty.* There we are implored to "Ponder anew, what the Almighty can do, if with his love he befriend you." When the Almighty sent the angel Gabriel to announce to Mary that she will conceive in her womb and bear a son, God did do something incredibly new! Because the angel also announced that Mary is to name the child Jesus, which means Savior. So quite clearly, with this news God chose to befriend us with his love!

Every year, it is life giving for us to, "ponder anew, what the Almighty can do." From the prophet Isaiah, chapter 43, the LORD says, "Do not remember the former things, or consider the things of old. I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert." It seems

strange for God to ever say, "Do not remember the former things..." Because God and God's prophets are usually telling us just the opposite — to recall and remember all the incredible blessings and actions God has showered on us. Yet I believe that for God's people at this time, living as exiles who were in captivity in Babylon, it was likely that they were stuck on (and in) the recent past or even stuck on (and in) their present intractable mess.

We too get stuck on (and in) our recent past. We also get stuck on (and in) our present messes. It may be due to gun violence, climate change, our deeply polarized politics, the wars in the Ukraine and Israel and Gaza, or something much more specific and immediate for you. Yet all of these ways that we can get stuck only cause us to limit our ability to ponder anew what the Almighty can do. Clearly, for those in exile, they must have felt certain that their best days were in the past and they probably believed that God had abandoned them. When that is the case, hope is utterly lacking. So when God does do a new thing, as God surely will do(!), the Israelites definitely needed to ponder anew what the Almighty can

Mary the Brave: Mary the God Bearer

As a young pastor and working mom, I struggled with the challenges of balancing work and home life, often while carrying a child in my womb, arms, on my hip, in a front or back baby pack, or car seat. Now my

children are adults, and I have the joy of watching them carry my grandchildren. They do it differently than I did, their car seats are much nicer than the ones we had, but like us, they carry their children with much love. I still carry my adult children and grandchildren and will always carry them, in my heart with much love. This Advent and Christmas season I'm reflecting on Mary, the God bearer. (In Greek it's Theotokos².) Mary carried Jesus. Like all parents she carried her child with love, but she is also the God bearer. It was a brave thing Mary did to bear God into the world.

To love is a brave thing. It is a brave thing to become a parent. Mothers put their own lives at risk bearing a child in their womb and giving birth. It requires a measure of bravery for parents to bring a child into this world filled with the bad news of climate disasters, gun violence, war, political upheaval, racism, food/water insecurity, and escalating health and higher education costs.

Luke 1: 26ff In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin engaged to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. The virgin's name was Mary. And he came to her and said, "Greetings, favored one! The Lord is with you... "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. And now, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you will name him Jesus. He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High,... the child to be born will be holy; he will be called Son of God... For nothing will be impossible with God." Then Mary said, "Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word." Then the angel departed from her.

History has painted Mary to be quiet, meek and mild, submissive to God's will, but a closer read shows us that Mary was brave. Mary was neither meek nor superhuman.³ She had grit. She was faithful, courageous, strong and brave. Most of all, she was human. Her encounter with the angel Gabriel, the messenger of God made her brave. She knew that her pregnancy was dangerous and she could die giving birth. She also knew that as an unmarried teenaged mother it would cause upheaval in her family and community. She would give birth to Jesus during Roman occupation, a time of political unrest. Mary was brave. Her encounter with the living God made her brave

Her encounter with God gave her bravery and the faith to see that if God was calling her God would also protect her. It revealed to her that God chooses the people on the margins, those overlooked and underestimated. Bearing God in the world was to bring good news and hope to those oppressed. May Mary, the God Bearer, inspire us all to be brave! This Advent and Christmas season, I invite you to be Theotokos, God Bearers. I invite you to carry the good news of Christ's birth, life, death and resurrection to all those we meet on this journey of life and the love of Jesus in your hearts always.

Financial Update

During this special time of the year, we pause to reflect on all we are thankful for. Family, friends, faith, and of course, since we are the Resource Team, we also include finances. We are thankful to all of you and your faithful giving. This year we have had some major expenditures with the front door and steeple repairs. Our total checkbook balance looks very healthy at \$40,236, but we need to keep in mind that we are holding \$6,000 in restricted funds for future fair stand improvements and \$9,835 in restricted funds that came in for Casas por Cristo donations and will go to pay for the housing materials for the home in Guatemala next month. We have several other restricted funds leaving our unrestricted fund balance at \$15,967.

While \$15,967 seems healthy and we are blessed to have it, we are down from the \$25,546 that we started the year with. Again, we did have some major expenses this year, but we are hoping we can build our unrestricted fund balance up before the end of the year to give us more of a cushion in the event of an unexpected emergency. As we enter this Christmas season and you consider how God has blessed you this past year, we ask you to prayerfully consider your giving to the church. Thanks so much to every one of you for your continued support to the missions and ministry of Holy Cross!
