Pastor's Ponderings

We have an amazing month of worship opportunities ahead! Beginning on Sunday, March 3, in our Gospel of Mark narrative, Jesus has arrived in Jerusalem and he proceeds to tell a parable known as the parable of the wicked tenants in **Mark** 12:1-12. This parable, along with "the question about paying taxes to Caesar" in Mark 12:13-17 only ramps up the already high amount of tension that Jesus' teaching and healing and welcoming of sinners have generated. Jesus is clearly leaning into the reading from Psalm 118 that he is "the stone that the builders rejected but it has become the cornerstone."

On **Sunday, March 10**, Jesus continues to teach in Jerusalem as in **Mark 12:28-44** he highlights the greatest commandment "Love the Lord your God with all your heart..." He also points out the great faith of the poor widow who "Put in more than all those who are contributing to the treasury."

On **Sunday, March 17**, Jesus goes deeper (and some might say darker) with his dramatic teachings in **Mark 13:1-8 and 24-37** as he speaks about the end of the age, the coming of the Son of Man, and the necessity for watchfulness because "about that day or hour no one knows, neither the

angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father."

On Sunday, March 24, we will celebrate **Palm/Passion Sunday!** Many of our high school youth will lead us with palms in telling the story of Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem from the Gospel of Mark II:I-II and then we will continue telling the story of Jesus' Passion and death according to Mark 14 and 15. As we have done previously, we immerse ourselves deeply in this service as it offers each of us the opportunity to discover our own rootedness in the Passion story. Easter Sunday is March 31! We look forward to celebrating Jesus' resurrection from the dead with you! Please come to either the 7:00 sunrise worship service or at 9:00

am. It will be a festive morning with Holy Communion offered both times, plenty of beautiful flowers, and songs of praise! Be sure to join in the festal shout, "Christ is risen! He is risen indeed, Alleluia!"

What are the two Sacraments celebrated in the Lutheran Church? The answer is Holy Baptism and Holy Communion which we have been learning about in Confirmation Class.



Recently our Confirmands, Mentors and Parents were invited to share in a "Seder Meal" which retells the story of the Israelites Exodus

from Egypt. It was during this "Passover Meal" that Jesus instituted the first "Holy Communion." He



broke bread with his disciples, shared wine, and commanded them to "Do this in remembrance of me." This meal would be Jesus' Last Supper, a celebration that has lasting significance for us today because it was during this meal that Jesus instituted the Eucharist. We shared Matzah (unleavened bread) and wine (grape juice) during the recalling

and retelling of the Passover Meal.



On Monday, February 19th, our class helped out at the North Saint Paul Food Shelf. We did several odd jobs (including sorting donations of cheese!) that Kathy, the director at the food shelf found extremely helpful. We then had a delicious Subway lunch, went to





the Como Zoo and Conservatory to see gorillas and tigers and bears, oh my! Thank you to Anna Mewis for chaperoning!

and experiences of Peter. On Wednesday, March 6 the theme is "Praise the Mount" as Peter goes up the mountain to witness Jesus' transfiguration. On March 13 our theme is "I'm fixed on it" as Peter is fixated on his belief that Jesus must not die. On March 20, our theme is "Teach Me" as the "all or nothing" personality of Peter draws closer to Jesus to learn, "How many times should I forgive?"

During **Holy Week**, we gather with Peter and the disciples at Jesus' Last Supper on **Maundy Thursday, March 28 at 7:00 pm**. At this meal, Jesus gets up from the table to

wash his disciples feet and we see Peter's familiar pattern of reluctance but then exuberance. Using the theme of "Streams of Mercy" this service also includes the special time of gathering with many young students who will receive their first communion. Lastly, the worship service concludes with the dramatic stripping of the altar in preparation for the day Jesus died on the cross.

On Good Friday, March 29 at 7:00 pm we will hear the Passion of Jesus according to Saint John who, in perhaps the irony of all ironies, saw Jesus' death on the cross as the moment of his triumph. Jesus is a victorious king who reigns victorious from the cross. In Peter though, we see how he is "Prone to Leave the God I love." Come to experience this series of lessons and songs that helps us to focus on the magnitude of God's love for us.
